Background

Public servant, children's advocate, and former teacher who ran in Southwest Ohio; campaign platform emphasized labor rights, tax relief, and benefits for families

Former public school teacher who entered the advocacy sector to expand resources for children in Cincinnati; has also worked internationally to invest in education, working with Ethiopian Jewish communities

Worked for the Ohio Governor's Office of Faith Based and Community Initiatives and served as chair of the Ohio Anti-Poverty task force under then-Gov. Ted Strickland (D-OH), where he developed partnerships between the government and community organizations to alleviate poverty

In 2016, Landsman successfully helped create the Cincinnati Preschool Promise, a public program subsidizing k-3 and k-4 for low income families

Elected city council in 2017, and since taking office has focused primarily on family and children's issues, including youth employment programs, early childhood education, and eviction prevention

Priorities as a city councilmember included expanding funding for police and fire services, labor and environmental regulators, and city pensions
